Recipe – "Lunch Lady" Brownies

ADAPTED FROM : <u>https://thesouthernladycooks.com/lunch-lady-brownies/</u>

INGREDIENTS:

- •1/2 C. unsweetened cocoa
- •2 C. all-purpose flour
- •1 ½-2 C. granulated sugar
- •4 large eggs
- •1 C. butter, melted
- •4 t. vanilla

<u>Frosting Ingredients:</u> •1/4 C. evaporated milk •1/4 C. butter softened •3 C. powdered sugar •¼ C. unsweetened cocoa

INSTRUCTIONS:



•Preheat oven to 350°F. Line a 9 X 13-inch baking dish with parchment paper and spray with a non-stick cooking spray, such as PAM. Combine cocoa and melted butter in bowl and mix well. Then, add flour and sugar. Continue to beat together – using an electric mixer, if needed. Next, add eggs and vanilla. Mix until combined, but don't over mix. The batter should be thick.

•Pour mixture into the prepared baking dish and spread out evenly. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

•Let cool 15 minutes, then, while they are still warm, add the frosting on top.

FROSTING DIRECTIONS:

Combine all frosting ingredients and beat with a mixer until smooth. Pour and spread out over the warm brownies. Let them cool completely before cutting.

NOTE: If your frosting seems too thick to pour, add a little more milk to create a better consistency before attempting to spread over the warm brownies.

When Carter's advanced technology skills and curiosity lead him to important knowledge about his town he must make a decision. Does he admit to being a snoop in order to do the right thing?

In true Gordon Korman fashion, this humorous mystery is a page-turner that will be a hit with middle grade readers!





Please Pay Attention by Jamie Summer | Published by Scholastic, April 2025 | Grades 6 and up

Bea has already had her share of challenges and is living a good life in a comfortable routine when tragedy strikes at her school.

Confined to her wheelchair due to cerebral palsy, the 6th grader must wrestle with the helplessness she feels in the aftermath.

This novel in verse is poignant and realistic with lots of heart. A gentle way to approach a very scary subject. I do recommend it with a caveat. Be sure to read it yourself when you add it to your collection, so you're prepared to discuss it with your students.

Featuring Taylor Swift: Facts, Quizzes, Activities and More! By Gena Chester | Published by Capstone Press, August 2025 | Ages 8-11

Swifties of all ages will love this engaging title packed with vibrant photos, fun facts, and interesting tidbits about the ever-popular Taylor Swift. The book includes interactive quizzes that both test fans' knowledge and invite future fans to learn more about the star's life, music, and career.

If your students are anything like mine, they can't get enough of Taylor Swift — and this book will definitely feed their fascination. I highly recommend adding it to your collection, and you might even want to grab more than one copy. It's bound to be in high demand!




Cannonball by Sacha Cotter | Published by Sourcebooks Jabberwocky, June 2020 | For Grades K-4

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

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


